As adults, Don and Colin are reunited, and put on trial the very man responsible for their separation – the Australian cricket captain in 1981, Greg Chappell. But the hijinks soon turn serious when the scab's ripped off their troubled past and the focus shifts to the real culprit: which parent was responsible for their lost childhood?

With a recently deceased dad and a terminally ill mum, today is about to become another game-changer - a tumultuous ride through sport, politics and the ugly side of broken families. ...And, of course, the perennial sledging match that is Aussie-Kiwi relations.
